

CBA beach projects

Installation of a Tiki Hut as a shelter for our beach lot was discussed. Mike Peters contacted Big Kahuna Tiki huts to get a price estimate for a structure the size of 12' by 16'. For 4 poles sunk into the ground with a palm frond covered roof, no floor, he was quoted \$5,700. It was suggested to spend an extra \$500 to get a letter from a Seminole Indian tribal chief to obtain the permit as an original tribal structure.

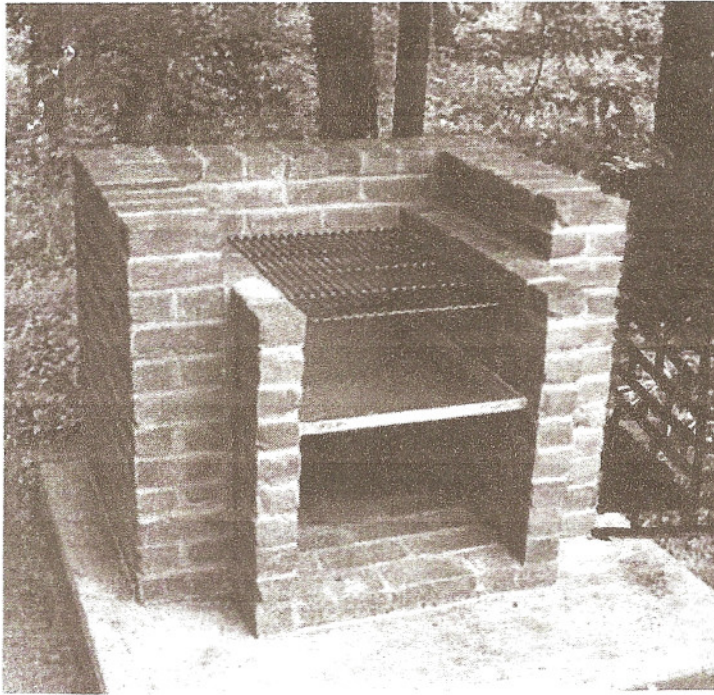
An example of such a hut is near Blackburn Pt. bridge in Nokomis. Sample pictures are below.

Above you see a Google Earth picture of the water side of our beach lot with an approximate location of the brick bbq-grill and the proposed Tiki hut. We will make sure that the grill will be placed so as not to create a fire hazard.

After all kinds of research my suggestion for a grill design went back to a very basic structure – see above. The grill in the photo measures 46" x 46" with a hand-drawn attachment to the side for sheltering a fire extinguisher and to have a place to put utensils etc. This would add an extra 24" to one side for a total width of 5'.

Any left over bricks could be used to create a brick-on-sand laid hard floor in front and to the sides of the grill.
